### News from the Annual General Meeting

On Monday September 23, 2024, the JCCC held its Annual General Meeting, at the JCCC in Shokokai Court. The meeting included a financial presentation that provided an overview of how the JCCC has progressed operationally and financially in the past year with a note that the Centre's cash forecasting has greatly improved thanks to the help and support of members of the JCCC Finance Committee.

It was reported that capital projects have been a priority for the Centre as it moves ahead to catch-up on a number of projects that were paused or impacted by the pandemic including re-grading and re-paving the entire JCCC parking lot, completion of the east entrance renovation and the tenant elevator refurbishment. JCCC President Chris Hope expressed the Board's thanks to retiring Board Member Nao Seko for his generosity with his time as the Centre's volunteer in-house construction manager for each of these projects. The completion of the new state-of-the-art sound system in Kobayashi Hall was also noted as a project which was completed with the support of a grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation (that was awarded to the Centre thanks to the hard work of JCCC Operations and Technical Manager Constantin Dutescu), a partnership with Yamaha Canada, and a generous donation by Marty Kobayashi.

We were happy to inform the membership that the JCCC has now surpassed pre-pandemic levels of engagement.

The membership also approved a few by-law changes – summary was sent in the October Newsletter.

We are pleased to announce the 2024-2025 Board of Directors. Every year, new Directors and renewing Directors are nominated for a three-year term, with all members of the Board subject to a nine-year limit. We welcome new directors approved this year is: lan Nagamatsu and Sho Ozawa. Renewing their terms were Chris Hope, Linda Ono and Brian Toda. Jan Nobuto was also returning to fulfill a one year vacancy. Retiring from the Board were Kristin Kobayashi-Reid and Mark Hashimoto who completed the nine-year term limit. Nao Seko also retired after serving multiple terms. The JCCC is grateful for their many years of service.

Continuing in their terms as Board members: Karen Gordon, Jon Nagamatsu, Sharon Marubashi, David Moritsugu, Elaine Shigeishi, Alexis Spieldenner, Demetre Vasilounis, Karen Webb and Kathy Wale.



After the close of business of the AGM, the new Board met and elected the Executive Committee for 2024-2025: President Chris Hope, VP Management Jon Nagamatsu, VP Heritage Karen Webb, Finance Chair Linda Ono, and Secretary Sharon Marubashi.

The JCCC Board of Directors also thanks every JCCC member for your ongoing financial and volunteer support.

The JCCC is continuing to focus on building for the future, increasing general audience and community engagement, and working on strategic planning initiatives. The Centre can attribute its successes to date to a dedicated and hardworking staff, its incredible and generous volunteer base, implementing fundraising programs, cost control initiatives, strong financial support from the JCCC Foundation, and strong relationships with our banking partners.

On the fundraising side, back by popular demand, the Keep the Lantern Lit Fundraiser is underway, and we are planning to host the 2025 Sakura Gala in May.

We have a busy year ahead, but we are very optimistic about the future - and the potential, of the JCCC.

## JCCC Partners with Next Music From Tokyo

The JCCC is proud to announce that it has partnered with **Next Music From Tokyo**, to deliver the largest showcase of live performances by independent Japanese musical artists in the world outside of Japan.


Toronto-based anesthesiologist Dr. Steven Tanaka founded the Next Music From Tokyo festival in 2009, which he has continued to produce and fund, as part of a personal mission to deliver the vibrance, creativity and passion of Japanese independent musical artists, to Canadian audiences.

Next Music From Tokyo blows up the stereotype that Japanese music has to be weird or a novelty to have any artistic value," explains Tanaka. "Canadian audiences are a little shocked at first at the passion and creativity of the Japanese artists. They're often blown away, and I love that many become serious fans and follow the careers of the artists. At this point I can't count the number of people that have come up to me and said 'that was the best show I've ever seen' and 'I need to know more about this music'. That's what really keeps me going."

All profits from the festival will be directed to the JCCC to support the construction of a music pavilion that will serve as a centre for music instruction, small group recitals, and as a permanent home for Kyowa Taiko, the JCCC's taiko group. Next Music From Tokyo joins the expanding roster of JCCC live music programming that in the past year has included sold out solo piano concerts by two of the most sought-after Japanese pianists of their generation, Kyohei Sorita and

Hayato Sumino (co-presented with Bravo Niagara! Festival of the Arts), and a fully staged four-night residency by Tokyo-based Led Zeppelin revival band Mr. Jimmy that replicated all aspects of Led Zeppelin's legendary 1973 shows at Madison Square Garden with exacting precision. All were held at the JCCC's world class performance auditorium, the Kobayashi Hall.

Although the JCCC has a long history of supporting performances by touring artists at major venues in Toronto, Next Music From Tokyo is the first JCCC-supported musical festival that will feature regular staged performances outside of the JCCC facility to, as Chris Hope notes, "consistently deliver an amazing cultural experience to audiences where they are", by maintaining its multi-city touring format.

### **Cranes For Ukraine Update**

In early 2022, as part of our Origami – The Art of Paper Folding exhibit, the JCCC community folded a senbazuru – 1,000 paper cranes strung together with wishes for peace. Our senbazuru was envisioned as a gift of health and peace, especially for the children of Ukraine who were brought to Canada to continue their treatments at SickKids Hospital. For the past two years, our senbazuru has hung in the Heritage Court.

In September, our senbazuru was moved to a new home at St. Volodymyr Institute, a Ukrainian cultural centre on Spadina Avenue. The institute is a multifaceted hub, encompassing a student residence, a theatre, a comprehensive library, an art exhibit space, and event spaces. It has been a cornerstone for educational and cultural activities, serving as a venue for numerous events such as theatrical and musical performances, art exhibitions, book launches, lectures, and more. 
fill out the form is November 30, 2024. We look forward to seeing our walls filled with artwork from the JC community again.

We are excited to announce that over 80% of martial participants have completed the integration into the M365 portal as a part of our Project Member First (more details below). Moving forward to future registrations, we expect that your experiences with the process will be much easier. Only one martial art remains to be fully integrated. Once that is completed, the Martial Arts Administrative Team will introduce more new and exciting options that are available through the M365 portal.

### **Project Member First**

After almost a year of hard work, the Martial Arts Administrative Team has been introducing our new registration portal powered by Members365 to our martial arts participants and instructors.

#### What is it?

The purpose of the "Member First" project is to improve our JCCC members' experience. It was originally initiated to address member feedback concerning our registration process. COVID protocols required stricter sign-up and entry procedures for the sake of member safety. It also increased expectations for digital transactions and payments.

With this in mind, the JCCC was able to secure a COVID recovery grant from the federal government to modernize our systems. One of the main goals of this project is to specifically address member feedback to streamline the registration process and make it more accessible, especially when Reception is closed.

As with any big system implementation, there are many changes and hiccups. We started with a small pilot and, as of writing, we have successfully brought in 5 programs and are working on the last few martial arts groups. We thank all those members and instructors for their patience and support as we continue to roll out the new registration process to the other programs. We also want to take this opportunity to thank our instructors for their continued dedication and commitment to the quality of JCCC programs and their support as we continue to work together to enable a safe and friendly environment for everyone.

#### When my martial arts club is brought onto the M365 system, what should I expect?

Instructors and members will receive a "heads-up" e-mail from the JCCC administration letting them know to expect a Welcome E-mail from the new membership platform MEMBER 365. In the past some have gone to members' junk folders so we want to let you know it is on its way.

The MEMBER 365 e-mail will include:

- · A password.

You will also find:

- · Link to a navigation guide created by the JCCC,
- Link to a calendar for booking one-on-one on-line technical assistance for those who need it.

The Member First team will also be available outside the dojo to take questions and provide assistance.

The JCCC thanks you very much for your help and patience. We know change can be a challenge - we are certainly experiencing some challenges ourselves – but in the end we are certain we can provide the best sign-up service in our history.



### 健やかな老後をめざして その78

私がわたしとなるために……

2024年連載では主に言葉について語ってきました。人はみな誰も自分自身の歩いてきた人生しか語ることができません。短くもあり長くもある人生……ただ1つはっきりしていることは、わたし(あなた)が主人公のかけがえのない物語。誰に勝るものでも劣るものでもない、唯一無二の貴重な物語なのですね。

あなたは、その物語をどう紡いできたのでしょう?そして、これからどう紡いでいきたいですか?「一所懸命にただ生きているだけ」とお答えになる方が多いかもしれません。私もその一人です。でも"紡ぐため"には、その折々の出来事や心情のどこに注目し、いかに引き出し、撚りをかけるか(内省・熟考する)が大事ではないでしょうか。

私にとっての物語……幾つかの転換点がありました。そのなかでも、夫John以外には頼る人とていないカナダへ51歳で移住し、当地の看護大学で働き始めたことは大きな出来事でした。日本の大学では、看護学科長と老年看護学主任教授を併任しながらの超多忙な日々でした!ところが、カナダで一人の教員として働く機会に恵まれたのです。初めてのセメスターは、新米教員(co-tutor)としてベテラン教員(tutor)と組んで、3年生10名を受け持ちました。管理職を離れ、初心に戻って教育に向かい合える機会に恵まれ、ワクワクしていました。偶然にも大分で働いていた頃に海外研修に参加し、本大学の教育方法を学びました。しかし、当時はカナダへ移住するなんて予想だにしていませんでした!

日本で教育学修士を取得後にアメリカへ留学し、看護学部&大学院の授業を受講した経験はあっても、英語圏で教員として働くのは初めてです。しかも、日本の教育方法とは大きく異なり、1クラス12名(教員を含む)の問題解決学習を基盤としたテュートリアルでは、従来のように教員が教壇に立って教えるのではなく、学生と教員が共に学習し、より深く考える機会をもち、それぞれが自身のすべてを試される場となります。

一人の学生が本時の活動促進役割(ファシリテータ)を担当し、その他の学生と同様に、教員もそのグループダイナミックスの中に巻き込まれていきます。すべての学生が一度はファシリテータを担います。さて、クラス活動の2回目、ファシリテータのアンが突然に「さあ、5分間の頭の体操です」と抜き打ちテスト。教員も一緒に受けるとは!薬物名は浮かぶものの長いスペルが……(涙)。アンが自己採点の結果を順に尋ね、「Eikoは何点でしたか?」。10点満点中の6点で、予想通り最低点でした。ベテラン教員が7点だったので、私は綱渡りの

綱からどうにか落ちずに済み、冷や汗タラタラ。また、話し合いの場はコメントする間がないほど白熱し、ネイティブのベテラン教員に比べ、新米の私は様々な意見を整理・統合しているうちに次の話題へ……流れに追いつくのが大変!

この厳しい状況は「Eikoがこの場にいる意義や意味、学生に何を資することができるのか」について突きつけるものでした。日本、アメリカ、中国や南米で学生、ナースや教員として種々の経験を積み重ねており「国際的な視野から事象を分析し、伝えることができる強み」に気づきました。それは、ネイティブ教員にはない特性でした。毎回その日の活動を丁寧に見直し、気づき(指摘・アドバイス)をその夜のうちに全員に発信しました。「鉄は熱いうちに打て!」です。もちろん復習・予習もしっかりと。日本人のもつ粘り強さと丁寧さを愚直に続けました。

セメスター最後、学生は所定の評価用紙で細かに教員を評価します。 自由欄には個別の書き込みもできます。「私が1年生だった頃のように、最初はEikoもヨチヨチ歩きだったのに英語が上達したね」「あなたのような情熱をもつ教師に初めて出会った」「いつも笑顔で迎えてくれて心が安らいだ」等。これらの言葉が働き続ける大きな力となりました。


